Wickliffe Soccer Makes History

For the moment, forget the fact that they fell just short of their ultimate goal. Focus instead on the mind-boggling accomplishments of the 2006 Wickliffe High School soccer team. In the space of just a few weeks, the team:

- Made the first state soccer final appearance in school history.
- **Won the school's first**-ever regional soccer title.
- **Clinched Wickliffe's first**-ever share of the Chagrin Valley Conference soccer championship.
- Had its first-ever player (senior Kenny Walker) voted onto the Boys Division III All-Ohio First Team.
- Brought together a community and a school district hungry for any positive news around which to rally.

It is perhaps this last point that will be the team's most enduring legacy. For a short while, a town that seemingly cared only about football and not much else on the athletic spectrum developed a full-blown case of soccer fever. From businesses to front yards to minivan windows, signs supporting the team sprang up everywhere around Wickliffe. People who didn't know the difference between a red card and a red light were suddenly throwing around words like "penalty kicks," "shootout," "offsides" and "midfield."

It all culminated on Nov. 10, when hundreds of Wickliffe devotees piled into their cars and made the 2-hour drive to Columbus Crew Stadium to see their beloved Blue Devils take on powerful Worthington Christian in the state Division III boys soccer finals. The game was everything a sports fan could have wanted – tense, hard-fought, action-packed, exciting. The only thing Wickliffe fans would have changed was the outcome.

After the two teams played to a scoreless draw through 110 minutes of regulation and overtime play, it came down to a penalty kick shootout – not the best way to determine a state champion in the minds of soccer purists, but still what the postseason rules call for when teams are tied through the second sudden-death overtime. Devils coach Chris Adkins sent his best shooters to the penalty spot against talented Worthington Christian goalkeeper Michael Dybdahl. Walker, sophomore twins Admir and Almir Suljevic, and senior Daniel Matic all took their best attempts, but in the end Worthington managed four shootout goals to Wickliffe's two. **Game over.**

Still, to judge the entire season on that one disappointing moment is to ignore everything the team accomplished on its way to the state finals. The journey included a win over long-time rival and top-seeded Hawken in the district finals, as well as a victory over Youngstown Cardinal Mooney in the regional finals – **revenge for Mooney's 1987 football** playoff victory over the Devils, for those whose memories stretch back that far.

Then there was the glorious 2-1 shootout win over Kidron Central Christian in the state semifinals. That **particular shootout went the Devils' way, but it took 10 rounds of penalty kicks** before senior defender Justin Silvaroli finally won it for Wickliffe.

Most of the individual postseason awards went to Walker, a once-in-a-generation talent who previously played for the U.S. junior national team before deciding to try his hand at high school soccer for a season. **But plenty of others contributed to the Devils' success**, including the Suljevic twins – Almir with his strong play at goalkeeper and Admir leading the team in scoring from his striker spot. Then there was senior Carly Clarke, a four-year starter at forward **who assisted on Admir Suljevic's goal in the win over Kidron Central.** Clarke became one of the few girls ever to start in an Ohio state boys soccer championship game. The community saluted the team with a parade down Euclid Avenue on a rainy night the week after the state finals loss.

Wickliffe finished the season with a sparkling 18-4-1 record, a mark that will set the tone for future Devils **soccer teams and perhaps make the school's fans everywhere realize that there's more than one kind of "football" being played on fall evenings in Wickliffe.**

A Drop-Out That Made It.

Hello. My name is Earl Donaldson and I dropped out of Wickliffe High school in my senior year. I had enlisted in the U.S. Navy. That was 1942. I had a work permit and was on the job, on December 7th, 1941. Having learned to fly at age 15, I went into the aviation part of the war. After all the testing and etc., the Navy put me through seven schools, including a tour at Pensacola. From that time on, I was a Flyboy.

I trained pilots in the F4F, F6F, SBD dive bombers, and three types of multi engine patrol aircraft. All of this training that I had received gave me the basis for my future. It was during this same time that I received my Wickliffe High School diploma through USAFI. It was signed by Mr. Walter Clark.

Upon receiving a medical discharge in 1947, I taught aircraft instrument over-haul at the North Island Naval Air Station, in San Diego, California as a government employee. I was later transferred to the U.S. Naval Ordnance Test Station at China Lake, California. It was later named the U.S. Naval Weapons Center. I was employed in the Aviation Ordnance Department, Missile design and development Division.

During my 21 plus years at China Lake, I was instrumental in the inertial guidance development and testing of the Sidewinder infrared guided missile. I later designed the mechanical radar gyro guidance head for the same missile. A short time after that I conceived, designed, fabricated and tested the first inertial guidance system for our first smart bomb.

From that point on I was consultant to NASA on their first deep space probe, and to the NATO nations concerning guided weapons. I have seven patents to my name, and a total of 36 awards from our government and some of the NATO countries. In 1973, I was given an early retirement at age 52.

I have spent 30 years in service to my country.

Frostbite

What is Frostbite?

Frostbite occurs when the skin and body tissues are exposed to cold temperature for a prolonged period of time. Hands, feet, noses, cheeks and ears are most likely to be affected.

What contributes to the likelihood of getting Frostbite?

- Extremes in age
- Homelessness
- Altered mental status due to head trauma, alcohol or illicit drug abuse, psychiatric illness
- Exposure to water or dampness
- Use of nicotine
- Previous cold injury
- Use of inadequate or constrictive clothing
- Underlying illness
- Malnutrition
- Infection
- Poor circulation
- Atherosclerosis
- Arthritis
- Diabetes
- Thyroid disease

How should Frostbite be treated?

Shelter the victim from the cold and move the victim to a warmer place. Remove any constricting jewelry and wet clothing.

Apply dry dressing (cotton clothing, gauze, etc) to the frostbitten areas. Put dressings between frostbitten fingers or toes to keep them separated.

Re-warm the affected areas as soon as possible. Submerge in warm (NEVER HOT) water -- or repeatedly apply warm cloths to affected ears, nose, or cheeks -- for 20 to 30 minutes. The recommended water temperature is 104 to 108 degrees Fahrenheit. Severe burning pain, swelling, tingling, and color changes may occur during warming. Warming is complete when the skin is soft and sensation returns.

Move thawed areas as little as possible to prevent further trauma.

Do Not

- DO NOT use direct dry heat (such as a radiator, campfire, heating pad, or hair dryer) to thaw the frostbitten areas. Direct heat can burn the tissues that are already damaged.
- DO NOT rub or massage the affected area with warm

hands or snow, as this can cause further injury.

- DO NOT disturb blisters on frostbitten skin.
- DO NOT smoke or drink alcoholic beverages during recovery as both can interfere with blood circulation.

Other winter safety tips

- Install a smoke alarm near bedrooms and on each floor of your home. Test it monthly. If it has a 9-volt battery, change the battery once a year.
- Install a carbon monoxide (CO) alarm near bedrooms and on each floor of your home. If your alarm sounds, immediately move to fresh air (either outdoors or near an open door or window). The symptoms of CO poisoning include headache, fatigue, dizziness, and shortness of breath.
- Keep portable space heaters at least 3 feet from anything that can burn, including bedding, furniture, and clothing. Never drape clothing over a space heater to dry.
- Before cold weather hits, make sure you have a way to heat your home during a power failure. Keep a multipurpose, dry-chemical fire extinguisher nearby when using alternative
- **Avoid overexertion. Heart attacks from shoveling heavy snow are a leading cause of deaths during winter.**
- Snow blowers (or snow throwers) are the fourth leading cause of finger amputations associated with consumer products. Do not put your hand in the snow blower to remove impacted snow or debris. Turn the machine off and wait a few seconds. Then use a stick or broom handle to remove the material.
- Have your car tuned up, check the level of anti-freeze, make sure the battery is good, and check your tire tread or put on snow tires to prepare for potentially treacherous winter driving conditions
- Keep emergency gear in your car for everyday trips:
 - cell phone
 - flashlight
 - jumper cables
 - sand or kitty litter (for traction)
 - ice scraper, snow brush, and small shovel
 - blankets
 - warning devices (e.g., flares, reflectors)
- If your car is parked outside, make sure the exhaust pipe and the area around it are free of snow before you start the car. Snow packed in or around the exhaust pipe can cause high levels of carbon monoxide in the car.
- Don't sit in a parked car with the engine running unless a window is partially open.

If your car gets stuck in the snow:

- Stay with your car. Do not try to walk to safety.
- Tie a brightly colored cloth (preferably red) to the antenna for rescuers to see.
- Start the car and use the heater for about 10 minutes every hour.
- Leave the overhead light on when the engine is running so that you can be seen.
- As you sit, keep moving your arms and legs to keep blood circulating and to stay warm.
- Keep one window away from the blowing wind slightly open to let in air.
